
FIRST, BUT NOT ALONE: POWER IN NUMBERS



WORKSHOPS

Students participated in three-plenary scaffolding workshops that included a design-thinking 5/10-year plan workshop (Success Coaching), introductions to resources/opportunities that can help students reach their career path milestones (AIP/ELT), and an interactive session for rapid resume/cover letter reviews and advising. All of the workshops led up to a networking dinner with first-gen alumni of UC San Diego.



CROSS-CAMPUS COLLABORATIONS

With support from the Career Center,
OASIS, Success Coaching Programs, and
the Teaching + Learning Commons,
students were introduced to internship
and experiential learning opportunities
as well as participated in an interactive
session with peer leaders from AIP, the
Writing Hub, Career Center peers and
advisors, and success peer coaches.



COMMUNITY-BUILDING

The conference fostered a space to strengthen the first-generation community on-campus through peer-to-peer engagement and the opportunity for students to share in a meal with members of UC San Diego's first-generation alumni network. Students were provided with a question guide, along with the knowledge and tips from the workshops, to help lead their discussions with alumni.
